Digital Records Project.

Recently our Brethren approved a recommendation that we raise funds to have our Lodge minute books digitally copied. This project has begun and the first four minute books are now completed and DVD's are available to order. The 4 minute books cover the period from 1875, which contains minutes from meetings held prior to our Charter being in February 1876 to just after the first World War ended in 1918. The computer programme allows pages to be brought up and can be scrolled and zoomed to give greater detail. Our plan is to raise Funds for this project to complete all our minute books and to date the figure

Our Lodge Roll Book has also been digitised and copies are now available to members at the cost of a donation to the Lodge D.R.P. Fund. Another project which is running in parallel is the Oral History Project. This involves digitally recording interviews with members of Lodges who have a story to tell about their time as a member of the Craft. One of the first minutes of our Lodge has been printed from the DVD's to give an example of the detail that can be obtained. This minute is historically important as it records the fact that our Lodge was formed at a Public Meeting ! Ours is believed to be the only known Scottish Lodge which was formed in this way.

District Of Central South Africa.

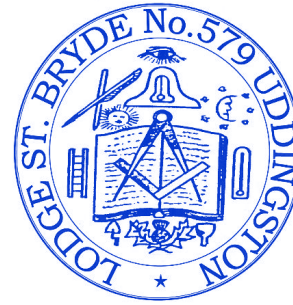
