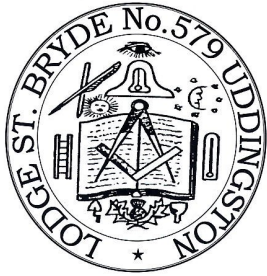


**Congratulations.**

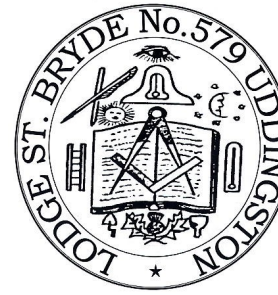
Lodge St. Bryde News.

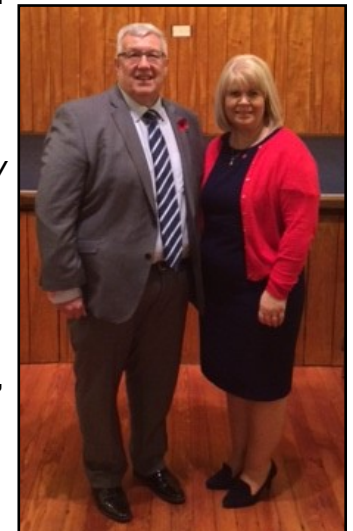
Lodge St. Bryde News.

Bob Read the Church Roll Keeper informed Stuart that he had an AGM notice from 1916 in which the Minister of the Church wrote a letter to the Congregation from the front while serving with the 1st. Batt. Scots Guards ! Our Lodge Roll was quickly checked and remarkably Rev. C.W.G. Taylor was Initiated into Lodge St. Bryde on 9th. December 1914 ! and even better news—we have his picture in uniform !!

**Somme Lecture.** The Lecture on the Battle of The Somme presented on 3rd. November by *The Somme Society* was an excellent evening. The well presented Lecture by Mrs. Carol Walker, MBE was well received by the Lodge Members and many friends present. The event raised £215 which was presented to Bro. David Johnston, P.M.
